Position: Summer School Teacher (Elementary) (two positions)
Effective: July 13 – 29, 2021
Building: Driftwood Elementary School
Hours: Tuesday through Thursday, 4 hours daily (approximately 50 hours total)
Wages: \$26.50 per hour (no benefits)

Job Goal: As the Driftwood Summer School (K/1st) or (2nd- 4th) Classroom Teacher, responsibilities include:

- Ensure that all classroom lessons are taught using curriculum as agreed upon with Summer School Head.
- Follow classroom schedule; ensure that Instructional Assistants follow classroom schedule as agreed on with Summer School Head.
- Translate lesson plans into learning experiences, using the designated curriculum. Teachers will need to adjust classroom activities to facilitate participation.
- Provide direction to Instructional Assistant(s). Maintain a positive classroom environment that is conducive to learning, and that guides and supports the transition into Kindergarten and First Grade / or into 2nd - 4th grades.
- Manage student behavior for the purpose of providing a safe learning environment, and in a way that supports the transition into Kindergarten and First Grade / or into 2nd - 4th grades.
- Attend staff meetings, center meetings, and/or other workshops/meetings as notified.
- Model behaviors that demonstrate an understanding, acceptance and welcoming of diversity.
- Maintain respect and positive communication regarding all children, families and staff.
- Maintain confidentiality of client and staff information.
- Adhere to Oregon/District requirements as a mandated child abuse reporter.
- Regular attendance is a requirement of the position.

- Holds or has the ability to hold Current Oregon Teaching License in Early Childhood Education.
- Experience working with children 3-6 and/or 6-8 years of age.
- Skills in planning and implementing appropriate curriculum and assisting students in realizing success.
- Knowledge of instructional theory and best practices for children 4-6 and/or 6-9 years of age.
- Knowledge of typical and atypical child development from birth to 9 years of age.
